MELVIN E. CORNWELL FAMILY

Gabriel E. Cornwell was born 9/6/1825 in Copetown, Ontario, Canada. His wife, Phoebe Coleman, was born 12/24/1824 in Brantford, Ontario. They had three children: Sarah Elizabeth, Melvin E., and William A. The family moved to Poplar Grove.

Gabriel E. Cornwell fought in the Civil War, he was captain of Company K. 95th Illinois Regiment. Gabriel was killed at Vicksburg on 5/22/1863.

Melvin E. Cornwell, born 4/14/1847, and his wife, the former Helen Beebe, born 7/21/1847, settled near Poplar Grove, Illinois, after their marriage 1/1/1867 in Beloit, Wisconsin. Six children were born in Illinois: Clarence, Fred, Nettie, Earnest, William and Wesley.

The eldest son, Clarence, at the age of 14, went to stay with his mother's brother, the Rev. Leonard Beebe, a circuit riding preacher in western Iowa. Clarence worked at jobs around Rolfe. The Melvin Cornwell family followed his move west within a few years. At first, Melvin plied the blacksmith trade, but in 1886 he purchased the Cornwell farm 2 south and 2 west of Rolfe (Roosevelt Twp., sect. 14). Melvin hauled rocks from Humboldt to Rolfe to help make payment on the farm he had purchased. The rocks were used to erect buildings being built in the town of Rolfe.

Wesley James Cornwell, born 10/18/1883, was three years old when his parents came to Rolfe. He was married 1/1/1901 to Dorothy Frances Wiegman (born 9/19/1879), daughter of Herman Frederick Wiegman and Betsy Ann Clark.

Wesley and Dorothy rented Melvin's farm from 1901-1905 until they found another farm to rent. In February 1909, the Wesley Cornwell family homesteaded in Midland, S.D. The crop was poor so they moved back to Iowa in 1910. In March of 1915 they moved to Morton, Mn., where Wesley had bought a farm. Their children were: Frances, Leonard, Irving Ivis, Bernice, Kenneth, and Wayne. A son and daughter, Verla, died in infancy. Wesley died 2/17/43 and Dorothy 7/1/67. Both are buried in Redwood Falls, MN.

When Melvin E. Cornwell died on 1/12/1929, the estate was divided equally among his children (32 acres each). Helen died 3/11/20. Both are buried in Rolfe.

In 1934, Irving Bernard Cornwell, Wesley's son, came back from Minnesota to rent his grandfather's farm, along with his uncle Will Cornwell. Irving was born on the farm 12/15/1904. On 9/14/35 Irving married Velma Joy Knapp, daughter of Harrison (Sr.) and Mary Jessie (Davidson) Knapp of Plover, Ia. Velma was born the same month, day, and year as Irving. By 1946, Irving had purchased all of his grandfather's farm from the heirs. Irving and Velma lived on the farm until 1978. Velma died

12/17/78 and is buried in Powhatan Cemetery near Plover. Irving retired and moved to Rochester, MN. to live with their daughter, Joy Jessie Cornwell, a librarian at Mayo Clinic. Velma was preceded in death by a son, Prentice Jay Cornwell. Irving now rents out the lowa land.
